Communications from:** 39 40 **President Marti:** President Eduardo J. Marti referred to his written report. 41 42 Dr. Marti expressed concern for Dr. Fung Chen, Finance Officer at 43 CUNY, who is gravely ill. He also indicated that the Presidential Lecture 44 had been rescheduled to December 7, 2005. Dr. Nazmunnessar 45 Mahtab, visiting Fulbright Scholar from Bangladesh, will speak on 46 November 16, 2005. 47 48 Dr. Marti reported that the first evening of cold-calling potential alumni 49 donors raised \$625.00. 39,000 letters have also been sent out in 50 support of this campaign. 51

The guest speaker at the Third Conference of the College on October 28, 2005 will be Dr. William Kelly, new president of the CUNY Graduate Center.

Senate Steering Committee:

Dr. Philip Pecorino, Chair of the Academic Senate Steering Committee, reported three items:

- Plans are underway to appoint a faculty member as a research assistant to the Steering Committee for special projects.
- With reference to the Committee on Environment, Quality of Life and Disability Issues, the By-Laws will be examined in order to determine a more appropriate purview of the committee.
- Dr. Pecorino distributed copies of Chancellor Goldstein's memo to CUNY College Presidents regarding the Fiscal Year 2006-2007 Budget request, soliciting input to present to Dr. Marti on behalf of the Senate at the meeting of the College Advisory Planning Committee on Thursday, October 20, 2005, in anticipation of a deadline of October 26, 2005.

Dr. Marti explained the components of the Chancellor's "visionary" budget, and emphasized that meaningful faculty input would need to take into account QCC's strategic plan.

Dr. Pecorino also indicated that Chancellor Goldstein had coupled his indication that tuition increases would be required in his proposed budget with an assurance that students were also to be consulted regarding expenditures.

The report of the **University Faculty Senate** was received.
