The Awards and Scholarship Committee meet four times in academic Year 2004-05 to evaluate and recommend nominations for the following awards and scholarships:

- 1. **John F. Kennedy Memorial Award** aimed at a graduating student who has demonstrated outstanding leadership in the college and community;
- 2. **Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Award** aimed at a <u>graduating</u> student who has demonstrated exceptional leadership in promoting racial harmony and appreciation of cultural diversity;
- 3. **Incentive Awards** aimed at <u>two</u> day students and <u>two</u> evening students who demonstrate outstanding academic performance and are <u>working parents</u>;
- 4. **Ray Ricketts Memorial Award** aimed at a returning student (left college at one point) who exhibits exceptional scholarship (Dean's List) and leadership;
- 5. **Women's Club Awards** aimed at current students (male or female) who have demonstrated outstanding leadership and service to the College community (minimum 30 credits and 2.75 GPA);
- 6. **The Meredith Young Endowed Award** aimed at a single mother who has either started or returned to college, has successfully completed a Basic Skills Writing class (BE112 or BE 205) and has completed requirements for a degree; and finally

7. **Who's Who in American Junior Colleges**—aimed at students who demonstrate scholarship, active participation in college and community activities, and potential for continued development (a minimum of 30 credits required).

The following table shows the number of applications we received and the actual awards made in Academic year 2005.
