President Diane Call called the fifth regularly scheduled meeting of the Academic Senate to order at -
3:19 PM

68 votes were recorded at the time attendance was taken; **70** members of the Academic Senate were present during the meeting (note: the first vote of the Senate was a mis-vote; the second vote was the official attendance).

II. Consideration of minutes of the December 12, 2017 meeting of the Academic Senate:

1. President Call

President Call referred to her written report (*Attachment B of the February 13, 2018 Agenda*.) For the full report, visit the [Academic Senate website](#).

Senator Clingan asked about the Excelsior Scholarship. The President responded that about 400 students had applied last year; 85 qualified.

Senator Lieberman delivered a prepared statement on the floor of the senate. He referenced the *New York Times* article from 12/26/17 which named him as someone who had published, as a co-author, in a “predatory journal.” He spoke of grants that he earned, his promotion to full professor, winning the faculty excellence award, all prior to the publication of this article in 2008. He also said that when he published in the journal, it was listed on Scopus (database of peer-reviewed journals). He pleaded for collegiality and argued that we all have a common goal here and we should be providing guidance to one another. He said, “The idea is not to make everybody look bad, it’s to try and help everybody look good.”

2. Senate Steering Committee Report

A discussion of the anti-bullying initiative was raised. Chair Kuszai spoke of various “scenarios” the subcommittee has encountered, one being the complaint “My chair hates me,” which leads to difficulties in promotion.

Senator Franco raised the subjective nature of the term “bullying” and questions whether “My chair hates me” is truly bullying. She argued that the term “bullying” needed to be defined.

56 Senator McGill urged Associate Professors who have problems with their chairs to work with chairs from

President's Report to the Academic Senate

ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT UPDATE

- The first two phases of freshmen students have been received by the Office of Admissions. With these two phases, nearly 7500 freshmen will receive notification of acceptance, which is an increase of 1600 students from Fall 2017. The College also received the transfer phase file, which included 100 admitted transfers. The Office of New Student Engagement hosted the first New Student and Family Welcome Session for the Fall 2018 enrollment cycle on Tuesday, February 27th. During the session, newly admitted students and their families learned more about the College, including the Academies and special programs such as ASAP, College Discovery, and CUNYStart. They also met with staff from Admissions, Financial Aid, and Testing to assist them with steps in the enrollment process.
- Academic advisement within the Queensborough Academies began on Monday, February 26th. Hobson Retain communications have been begun and is ongoing to all Academy students.

RESOURCE ALLOCATION PLANNING FOR FISCAL YEAR 19

- The University cut the QCC's Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 funding by \$1.15 million this January, citing reduced State base aid associated with community college enrollment declines. This cut has been baselined in the College's FY 2019 budget, forcing the College to work with less resources going forward. As a result, the College will be asking departments to reexamine their regular recurring budgets, consistent with the reduced enrollment, as part of QCC's annual Resource Planning & Allocation Process for FY 2019. By early March, all divisions and departments will have been provided with historic information and templates to assist in preparing budget requests for the coming academic year. In keeping with our practices, this process is designed to ensure our resources support our highest priorities, as reflected in the Strategic Plan developed by the College Advisory Planning Committee. Through the respective Vice President, each Division will submit budget request proposals for funding related to strategic priorities and operational needs. These proposals will be reviewed and prioritized by the Cabinet. The Budget Subcommittee of the Faculty P&B Committee and the QCC Academic Senate Committee on Budget Advisement will be consulted prior to our final expenditure plan for FY 19.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Middle States

- The self-study process continues. Led by the three executive co-chairs—Dr. Antonella Ansani, Dean Arthur Corradetti, and Prof. Kelly Ford—seven working groups are each developing a chapter of the self-study report, each chapter devoted to one of the seven Middle States standards. Chapters of the self-study report will be completed by June. A draft of the full self-study report will be distributed to the campus for comment and suggestions in Fall 2018; the full self-study report is due to Middle States in February 2019. An evaluation team chair, Dr. Joann La Perla-Morales, president at Middlesex Community College, has been selected for the college's site visit. Dr. La Perla-Morales will make a preliminary site visit in the fall, on a date yet to be determined, will provide comment and suggestions for the draft self-study report, and will then return with the full evaluation team in March 2019. At that time, the evaluation team will be on campus for two and a half days, providing a preliminary site visit report before they leave campus. The Middle States Commission will make a final decision on the college's reaccreditation in June 2019.

Academic Momentum Plan

- **STEM Waiver** - As previously reported, \$167,000 of the STEM Tuition Waiver Program funds were used during the winter 2018 session. 98% of the students completed their courses: 48.5% received a grade of A, and 88.6% achieved a grade of C or better. The balance of the funding will be available for Summer Session 1. We are still waiting for a decision from the Mayor's office as to additional funding for the academic year 2019, which includes Summer Session 2.
- **Milestone Scholarship** - Of the 30 Milestone scholarships awarded in the winter 2018 session more than 50% of the students received an A or A- and 90% received a grade of B- or better, with no student getting an F. We will continue the Milestone Scholarship for the summer 2018 sessions to help students reach their "30-credit milestone."

STUDENT RESOURCES

- Emergency funding is available to students who face a financial crisis that puts at risk their continued enrollment toward a degree. The Carroll and Milton Petrie Foundation funds provide one-time, emergency grants to students in good academic standing with short-term financial emergencies to enable them to remain in school. **Steering Committee Report

Today we are joined by participants in the Student Affairs Leadership Enhancement and Development Series (SA LEADS). Designed to foster the networks that support students, SA LEADS provides a professional development opportunity for current and emergent campus leaders through seminars with administrators from QCC and CUNY Central, faculty and staff, as well as outside professional development consultants. Started by Vice President Hodge in 2015, the SA LEADS program has had 37 participants, many of whom have gone on to leadership roles at the College. The Academic Senate welcomes the current cohort of SA LEADS participants: Linda Evangelou (Admissions); Thomas Byrnes (Admissions); Alexandra Pyak (ASAP); Connie Peluso (Career Services); Katwica Desruisseaux (College Discovery); Patricia Canale (Registrar); Moira Adams (Sponsored Programs).

The SA LEADS is a model program, one we would like to see more of on this campus. However, it is not as if there are no programs like this: The Office of Student Affairs has long been involved in the development of student leaders; this year the Faculty Executive Committee advertised a project aimed at cultivating future leaders of the faculty; even the Steering Committee has proposed a reading group as a way of bringing people together to discuss the issues. One reason the SA LEADS program succeeds is that it provides a dedicated time and space for professional development. Something like this might be useful in developing faculty to participate in various aspects of campus life. For example, the UFS sponsors budget training for Faculty Governance Leaders (FGL) and those appointed by them. Too much of the campus knowledge base is disseminated through the generosity of informal mentoring and we need to do more to create a sustainable social ecology of campus governance.

Currently, each standing committee engages in sustaining its own leadership and knowledge base through the committee guides and the culture of each the committee. These guides are indispensable resources as new members of a committee learn the charge as well as how to undertake the work involved. Rotating members in on staggered three-year terms has had the desired effect, with senior members taking on leadership roles after gaining adequate information and experience. While experience on committees is essential, we have a problem if the guides are not satisfactory in relating the information required to incoming members. We have failed, if after three years we have a situation where no one wants to chair a committee or no one is in a position to serve, or they do not have the requisite standing or experience. We should never be in a position where we are subject to the grace of a single individual who does more than everyone else, and we should be wary to let those do it for credit, just as we should be wary to let others do it from the shadows, invisible to all but a few.

Related to this, and something that the Steering Committee has been concerned with for the last year has to do with record keeping. We've had discussions in the Academic Senate about how to record votes and how to present that information so that it's in compliance with Perez, and the Committee on the Bylaws, led by Susan Jacobowitz, has met to consider how to find the sweet-spot of transparency and privacy protection. But this issue has exposed a whole order of issues that has not been documented properly in the Steering Committee Guide nor anywhere else, and that has to do with the issue of electronic record keeping. Currently, paper archives are kept by the College Archivist Constance Williams, but since the arrival of the clicker system we've only had an ad hoc means of keeping the clicker reports, which contain more than we are required to report, such as voting records for our elections or other matters not covered by Perez. It is the position of the Steering Committee that there should be some official College repository of the digital records of the Academic Senate Steering Committee, including not only clicker reports but electronic versions of meeting agendas, reports, basically all the attachments sent out each month that are also available online. More than one Middle States working group has pointed out files missing from the college website, a problem made much worse since the College has been forced to remove files that are not compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

While we will engage the archivist, the Administration, FEC as well as other stakeholders (such as in IT), in seeking advice in how to best do this, we invite anyone interested in these issues to get in contact with us over the next weeks as we consider solutions and prepare to update the Steering Committee Guide.

What are PNET/FNET classes?

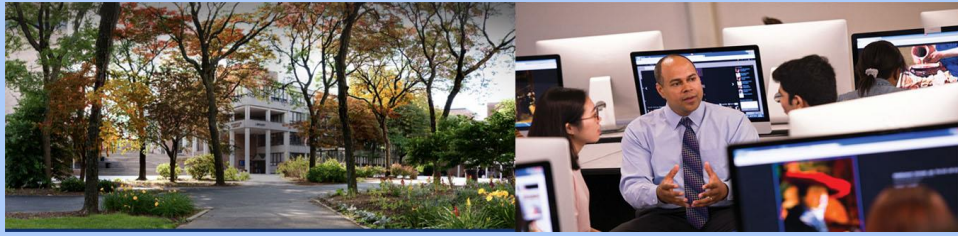
Types of eLearning courses at Queensborough:

Technology Update

News from the Office of Educational Technology (OET)

Blackboard upgrade is currently scheduled to begin on Thursday, December 28th at 12:30 am and to be completed by the close of business on Friday, December 29th. Blackboard will be taken offline and there will be no access to the environment during the upgrade. This upgrade will not introduce major new functionality into Blackboard, but there are some minor changes that will make Blackboard easier to use

By default, all Blackboard Courses are unavailable to students when they are first created--as indicated by the text "(unavailable)" next to your course name. This allows you some time and privacy while building your course. Once you have finished building your course in Blackboard, you will need to **MAKE YOUR COURSE AVAILABLE** to students. Otherwise, please inform your students that you won't make it available.

Committee Activities

- Last semester, the FEC created a “Faculty Association” bank account, which has been holding money from faculty who prefer to donate by check to the Lucille A. Bova Food Pantry. As of this writing, this money has been used to reimburse Amazon/Cosco orders to the pantry, upon the presentation of receipts approved and recorded in meeting minutes by the Committee on Food Insecurity. FEC Treasurer Margot Edlin has both received checks from generous donors, and disbursed reimbursement funds to Dr. Susan Jacobowitz, and to herself, as the Food Pantry was stocked, in December and January, by two separate trips to Cosco. The FEC report regarding donations and expenditure of these funds, received by the Committee on Food Insecurity in February, 2018, has been appended to this report (please see below).
- In a recent presentation from the Faculty Executive Committee Chair, Dr. Pecorino to the Committee on Food Insecurity, has indicated that, while the FEC is happy to have been able to assist fiscal (rather than in-kind) Food Pantry donors by providing a bank account, it is the fervent hope of the FEC that this arrangement could transition into a the establishment of the Lucille A. Bova Food Pantry as a separate, non-profit entity, as soon as possible, as members of the FEC have expressed reservation regarding possible

liabilities to the FEC. This process is now underway. As of this writing, members of the Committee on Food Insecurity, working in tandem with members of the FEC, are reviewing the following possible names for the Food Pantry:

- Oakland Food Pantry Association
- Bayside Food Pantry Association
- Northeast Queens Food Pantry Association
- Bayside College Food Pantry Association
- Bayside Campus Hunger Coalition (or Alliance).

The last, as of this writing, has strong support. Members of the Food Insecurity Committee will be meeting, either 3/14 or 3/21, to decide on a name, and to proceed further with steps to becoming a non-profit as outlined at this website, generously supplied by Professor Christine Mooney: <https://www.dos.ny.gov/corps/nfpfaq.asp>.

Professor Tai has also been in contact with the Director of the Nassau Community College Food Pantry, Dr. Sharon Masrour, to query insurance company recommendations; and with members of the Faculty Consortium, at the CUNY Law School, who facilitated the Non-Profit incorporation of Books Through Bars.

- Dr. Lana Zinger has also been working with Mr. Jonathan Chin on a service-learning project in which students will participate in the *Love Through Food* campaign, partnering with a New York based Outreach Program dedicated to addressing Food Insecurity among college students. This organization, which is non-profit, will be accepting cash donations to create “meal packages” of non-perishable foods, which will be donated to the Lucille A. Bova Food Pantry. Every \$1 donated will provide **20 meals**. Interested faculty may donate here: <https://www.classy.org/team/156671>
- Professor Tai has also been in contact with Father Edward Doran, the new director of the Newman Center. Father Edward has indicated that the Newman Center will continue to partner with the Committee on Food Insecurity, by offering students who visit the Newman Center fresh fruits. A student event to celebrate this continuing partnership will be planned.
