- Review of March 10th, 2016 minutes was approved with some minor changes
- Bruce Naples report and update on following items

Blackboard:

- The following Third-party tools are made available by attaching them to via Bb building block or LTI:
- Existing: VoiceThread, SoftChalk, PlayPosit (formerly EduCanon), and Starfish. We have requested that these be automatically activated in every QCC course shell starting in Fall 2016
- TurnItIn, a plagiarism detection program similar to SAFE Assign is still being tested in the Blackboard Staging Environment
- It is still our hope that Digication will be activated sometime before FA16
- Fall 2016 course shells should be available by July 1st

Other Items:

- Previously reported Blackboard bugs have not-yet been resolved:
 1. The Default display order for discussion forum entries has been set to "List" rather than "Tree" view. This must be manually set to "Tree" every time one reads and responds to a post.
 2. When you create a VoiceThread Assignment you must leave the text area below the assignment-link empty or an error will occur when the link is clicked. This is a known bug in Blackboard.
- SoftChalk has announced a major upgrade to SC10. We will be introducing its new features at our SoftChalk workshop - see below for the dates.

eLearning Institute:

Whereas, the Committee on eLearning has existed as an independent Standing Committee of the Academic Senate for a decade, and

whereas, Article VII, Section 20. "The Committee on eLearning" of the Bylaws of the Academic Senate continues to refer to the Committee by its former subcommittee name "The Committee on Distance Education,"

the Committee has unanimously voted at its April 14th, 2016 meeting to recommend amending the Bylaws as follows:

From (existing):
Section 20. The Committee on eLearning

The Committee on Distance Education shall consist of nine (9) faculty members and two (2) students. All faculty and students should be familiar with online instruction. Faculty shall come from different departments so as to be representative of the wide range of disciplines and degree programs at the college.

The Committee on Distance Education shall:

- a. Report and make recommendations to the Academic Senate on all matters related to Distance Education, in particular, concerning policies and procedures related to the development of, support for and offering of programs, degrees and classes;
- b. Work on the assessment process and criteria related to the Distance Education program of the College and report findings to the Academic Senate;
- c. Serve as an advisory body for all matters related to Distance Education.

To:
Section 20. The Committee on eLearning

The Committee on eLearning shall consist of nine (9) faculty members and two (2) students. All faculty and students should be familiar with online instruction. Faculty shall come from different departments so as to be representative of the wide range of disciplines and degree programs at the college.

The Committee on eLearning shall:

- a. Report and make recommendations to the Academic Senate on all matters related to eLearning (distance education), in particular, concerning policies and procedures related to the development of, support for, and offering of online, partially online and web-enhanced program, degree and classes;
- b. Work on the assessment process and criteria related to the eLearning program of the College and report findings to the Academic Senate;
- c. Serve as an advisory body for all matters related to eLearning
